Rationale:

The extensive literature on UN peace operations has provided practitioners and academics with a breadth of explanations and answers to the fundamental question of whether or not UN peacekeeping works. She offers a new typology that explains how peacekeeping differs from other forms of intervention and identifies three essentials of power in peacekeeping: persuasion, inducement, and coercion.

Lise Morjé HOWARD



Dr. Lise Morjé Howard is President of the Academic Council on the United Nations System (ACUNS). Professor of Government and Foreign Service at Georgetown University, Professor Howard earned her M.A. and Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of California, Berkeley, and her A.B. in Soviet Studies from Barnard College, Columbia University. Fluent in French and Russian, she previously served as founding director of the Master of Arts Program in Conflict Resolution at Georgetown; Assistant Professor of Government at Wesleyan University;

and Acting Director of UN Affairs for the New York City Commission for the United Nations. Dr. Howard is an award-winning scholar, and has published articles on UN peacekeeping, the UN Security Council, civil war termination, and American foreign policy in the top journals in her field, including International Organization, International Security, International Studies Quarterly, Foreign Affairs, and Global Governance.

Mr. Yasushi Akashi is former Under-Secretary-General of Public Information, Disarmament Affairs, and Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator. He is also former Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Cambodia and former Yugoslavia. Mr. Akashi graduated with Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Tokyo in 1954, studied as a Fulbright Scholar at the University of Virginia, and later at The Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy at Tufts University.
