### **Yasushi AKASHI**



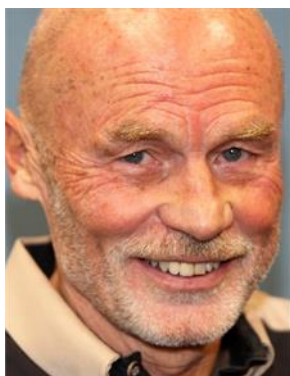
Mr. Akashi graduated from the University of Tokyo in 1954. As a Fulbright Scholar, he studied at the University of Virginia and later at the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy. He joined the United Nations Secretariat in 1957 and held numerous positions in the UN. After serving as Ambassador at the Permanent Mission of Japan to the United Nations, he was appointed as UN Under-Secretary-General for Public Information and later for Disarmament Affairs, Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Cambodia and then for the Former Yugoslavia, and then Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs until the end of 1997. He is currently Chairman of the Kyoto International Conference Center and Vice-President of the United Nations Association of Japan.

### **Sukehiro HASEAGAWA**



Professor Sukehiro Hasegawa is the President of Global Peacebuilding Association of Japan, Director of Kyoto Peacebuilding Center and Director, ACUNS Tokyo Liaison Office. He is also Executive Director for Academic Exchange, UN Association of Japan (UNA-Japan). He is former Special Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations for Timor-Leste. UN Resident Coordinator and UNDP Resident Representative in South Pacific, Rwanda and Timor-Leste; Deputy Executive Coordinator of the UN Volunteers Programme; UNDP Deputy Assistant Administrator and Regional Director for Asia and the Pacific; and Director of Policy Planning, UNOSOM II. He is Distinguished Professor of Kyoto University of the Arts.

### **Wolfgang PAPE**



Dr. Wolfgang PAPE is currently a free writer after recent Fellowships in Seoul and Taipei. During his service in the European Commission over 30 years, including postings as a diplomat in Tokyo, he was at EU-HQ in Brussels in charge of the 'Asia Strategy' and contributed to the 'White Paper on Governance' in the Think Tank of EC President Jacques Delors, following a Fellowship at the Brookings Institution in Wash. DC. After graduating from High School in Rochester, N.Y. and his Abitur in Kassel (D), he studied law and economics at the universities of Marburg (D) and Genève (CH), researched during two years at Osaka Gaidai (J), Kyoto University (J) and Harvard (USA) for his Dr iuris in Freiburg (D) in 1981. Before joining the EU, he served as Advisor at the

Japanese Embassy in Bonn. His publications in English, German, Japanese and French are ranging from cultural diversity to trade issues and global governance, for which he coined the term of “Omnilateralism.”
