Military turnover took place last October. Right after the event, Prime Minister and other senior political leaders were detained and State of Emergency was announced. Prime Minister Hamdok was released and made an agreement with Mr. Burhan, Chairman of Sovereign Council and Head of Sudan National Army on November 21. However, civilian protests continue, and Mr. Hamdok announced his resignation from the post of Prime Minister on January 2. Sudan was under the process of democratic transition since the revolution 2019. What is going on in Sudan? In this seminar, through Mr. Sakane's hands-on experience, current political process will be briefed and discussion will be conducted on how to support democratic process in Sudan.
